FIRST LEARNING TREE

What is a great preschool without a great team? At First Learning Tree we love to brag about our impressive staff retention which, in the field of early childcare, staff turnover is very high.

Last year, Texas Workforce Solutions implemented a "Staff Retention Bonus" to reward employees that have remained with their centers for a specified duration of time. This fall, another bonus was issued, and First Learning Tree received \$22,800 in reward money for our employees. Full-time teachers received \$1,100 each, part-time teachers received \$700, and support staff received \$500. As you can imagine, this is a large blessing to our staff, and it has lifted their spirits here adding more value to their jobs. Approximately 1,100 childcare centers in the Coastal Bend received bonuses, and our center was the third largest recipient, and we were invited to attend the check presentation with a handful of other preschools. I was honored to represent First Learning Tree.

When I first took over as the Director, at the first Church Council I attended, the council told me they wanted to see significant raises for our employees. Since then, we started offering compensation that exceeds other childcare centers in the Coastal Bend, and our teaches are so appreciative. After Hurricane Harvey, the church and school worked together to pay our staff during evacuation and rebuilding time. During COVID, when most jobs withheld pay, we were able pay all employees full compensation. Our staff knows they can count on us, and that is what keeps us going strong.

Thank you to our staff and church for working together to make First Learning Tree the wonderful school it is.

I am continuing to see many patients each month. Thank you to the church staff, volunteers, & church members for your help and support. I had a total of 75 encounters in October and 65 for November.

First Learning Tree partnered with me to fill the Thanksgiving Blessing Bags! We served 43 families which included approximately 140 individuals. I received many text messages and pictures of turkeys with expressions of gratitude and thanks. Thank you to the Health Ministry Team members, Cierra, Jeannie, Janet, Hannah, and Pam for helping organize the bags and distribute. Also, William was a tremendous help to me with distribution of the bags.



Our emergency food pantry has served many individuals this month and the shelves are well stocked; we can always use the following items. Pop top soups, canned meats, canned beans, crackers, and bottled waters. Frozen TV dinners are always needed. Thank you all who donated and continue to support this ministry of the church. The food pantry is used only when Good Samaritan's is closed.
