I think most of you will agree that love is complicated and relationships can be very hard to navigate. Scripture has many examples of complicated, yet beautiful relationships that we can all learn from. This month Paul and I have worked together on a February Sermon Series called “Love is Complicated” which will focus on Love, Relationships, and how our relationship with God is at play in all our relationships. I am so excited to take this four-week journey!

February 1st, I will be preaching both services with a focus on Adam and Eve, their relationship as a couple and their relationship with God, looking at how love was created as covenant before it became romance, and it broke not through passion, but through fear, blame, and hiding.

February 8th, Paul and I will be looking at Abraham & Sarah with the focus on when love grows weary of waiting, even faithful people are tempted to take shortcuts that wound each other and complicate God’s promises.

February 15th, Paul will be preaching both services with a focus on Jacob, Rebekah & Leah and when love plays favorites and withholds affection, God works through the overlooked and unloved to carry redemption forward.

FIRST LEARNING TREE

With each new year, First Learning Tree strives to enhance our program with extra-curricular activities that are engaging and educational. This year, we launched "Life Skills" classes on Tuesday mornings. During these classes, our Pre-K students learned valuable, applicable skills they may show their families.

The first session was about laundering which taught our students the different ways to wash and dry our clothes. This included wash boards with soap and clotheslines outside along with modern appliances and how to use them. We then taught our students how to sort laundry and different settings to use with the machines. This session ended with learning how to fold and put away laundry. 



Coastal Bend Emmaus will soon host the first Women's Walk of 2026. Women's Walk #2022 will take place June 25–28.

At first glance, that may sound like a big-time commitment—but stay with me. The Walk begins Thursday evening, with arrival around 5:30 p.m. You'll gather all day Friday (yes, that does mean missing one workday), all day Saturday, and conclude around 4:00 p.m. on Sunday. When you do the math, it comes out to 72 hours.

And those 72 hours are full. You'll hear talks from a variety of speakers. You'll take part in small-group discussions. You'll worship, sing, laugh, and experience genuine Christian fellowship.

You will also eat well. Very well. In fact, if you leave hungry, you're doing it wrong.
