

Happy New Year! Praying for 2026 to be filled with good health, prosperity, peace, and love for all of you!

I am continuing to see many patients each month. Thank you to the church staff, volunteers, & church members for your help and support. I had a total of 70 encounters in December.

Our emergency food pantry has served many individuals this month and the shelves are well stocked; we can always use the following items. Pop top soups, canned meats, canned beans, crackers, and bottled waters. Frozen TV dinners are always needed. Thank you all who donated and continue to support this ministry of the church. The food pantry is used only when Good Samaritan's is closed.

Special request this month is razors and deodorant for men and women.

Tree of Hope: This project was once again a huge success thanks to the church's support. We served 28 individuals. Many of these individuals indicate that our gift is the only gift they receive and they are truly thankful. We served individuals who are unsheltered, living in shelters, single mom's and dad's, the young and the elderly. I received so many pictures with happy smiles that made this project at a very busy time of year all worthwhile.

I also was able to coordinate with Habitat for Humanity to get Christmas trees and decorations for 4 of my client's families. It was so fun to watch them choose trees and decorations. A huge blessing to these families.

And lastly, I partnered with my CrossFit gym, Rising Tide Fitness, to sponsor several children for ice skating. These children would not have been able to attend the skating event without Rising Tide sponsoring the entry fees. The kids were so excited!


